



The first stage of grief



# Solar Eclipse 2024: Thousands Expected in WR

Lock your doors, stay off the streets, and expect thousands of travelers to rush into town on April 8, 2024. Walnut Ridge, Arkansas is going to be "The Spot" for solar eclipse watching.

The town will have complete darkness for an estimated four minutes and twenty-eight seconds at 1:45 p.m..

There are partial, penumbral, and hybrid solar or lunar eclipses that can occur one to seven times in a year. However, total eclipses vary and do not happen often.

The last total solar eclipse in the United States was visible from Oregon to South Carolina on August 21, 2017. And the last total solar eclipse in the world was only visible from Chile to Argentina on December 14, 2020.

Arkansas has not seen a total solar eclipse since 1918, so this April is a phenomenon!

As of right now, all Lawrence County schools have dismissed classes on April 8 due to the concern of extreme traffic congestion from incoming travelers. Yay!

The word on the street is treat it like a snow storm: Get your gas and groceries early, before the shelves and stations are empty.

A total eclipse is something we do not get to see often, so enjoy it, no matter how short it will be.



received was "Do your best, always" - Lana Pyle. She looks forward to majoring in Criminal Psychology after school and simply "starting her life."


Her role models are her sisters because she has always looked up to them. When Onyx was little, she wanted to be a nurse, now she wants to pursue a career in Criminal Justice.
