Students got a quick overview of the new library additions, including games, music and snacks. Highlights include new computers, new books, and a new student center, providing students easy access to printers, staplers, hole punchers, posterboards and more.

In the past three months, Mrs. Mary replaced the old computers with new ones and weeded out (discarded) more than1,100 books. The discarded items included 60- to 10-year-old books that had not been checked out in several years, or the material was no longer relevant.

New books and more current materials are arriving daily. She is no longer using the Dewey Decimal System in the non-fiction center to make categorization and finding books easier.

The changes, which are only getting better, began this summer as Mrs. Ross retired and Mrs. Mary's responsibilities moved from teaching business classes (and sponsoring FBLA) to librarian/ media center specialist and Book Club sponsor.

Halloween activities were led by Mrs. Mary and her teacher's aides and refreshments were served.

WRHS is so excited to see the changes coming to the library, and the big plans Mrs. Mary has in store.

The Sr. High Lady Cats' volleyball team finished as Co-Conference Champions (14-2) with multiple players being awarded at conference and state-level.

Maddie Buris (Senior) #18: All-Conference, All-State, All-State Tournament Team, Glenn Sain Nominee/Winner twice, and Farm Bureau Player of the Week twice. The team's captain, she led in stats with 68 aces, 586 assists for the season, the school record for most assists, and reached 1000 career assists during the last conference games.

Michelle Moore (Senior) #3: All-Conference, All-State, Glenn Sain nominee twice, and Fam Bureau Player of the Week twice. She led in stats with 248 kills, and 70 blocks, and reached 500 career kills during the season.

Avery Anderson (Senior) #14: All-Conference and Farm Bureau Player of the Week. Avery was a leading outside hitter with 175 kills.

Alli Bramlett (Senior) #7: All-Conference and Farm Bureau Player of the Week. She was a utility player with 49 aces, 62 kills, and 220 digs.




